

The Tabor City Council met in regular session on **February 8, 2018** in council chambers, 626 Main St., Tabor, Iowa at 6:00 p.m. for a regular session. Agenda posted as required by law. Meeting was opened by Mayor Switzer with councilpersons Williams, Clapper, Wirth, and Bartholomew, City Clerk Mary King-Bateman. Motion by Bartholomew, seconded by Clapper to approve the proposal for an audit of the City of Tabor financial statements. All Ayes. Nays 0.

Randy Wirth advised the council of proposed cost for a new sidewalk in the area of Main and Elm Street. The council requested a formal proposal.

Discussion about the condition of the roof on the old Fire Station.

Visitor Scott Richardson updated the council on the status of the possible sale of the Fremont County Landfill.

Mitch and Robin Worcester were present to discuss a section of land the city owns south of Tabor Manor along 110th Street.

Motion to approve the proposed budget by Bartholomew, seconded by Clapper. All Ayes.

Public Hearing set for March 12, 2018 to approve the final budget.
