Brad Moberg and John Hatcher from Windstream were in attendance to discuss with the council the city's internet broadband infrastructure. A fiber upgrade is in progress. The backbone is in place and will be spliced 1-31-2022. Crews will then be hanging fiber over existing cable. Tentative finish date in March 2022. Customers should contact Windstream to request fiber upgrade and inquire on costs. The city will pass on available promotional materials received from Windstream.
